Lake County's Human Trafficking Taskforce was established in 2012, with the mission of combating all aspects of human trafficking through increased public awareness, coordinated investigative response, trained professionals and victim services. Services to victims include emergency housing, food, medical exams, and mental health treatment.

## January Casino Night Fundraiser


