Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK)

Eight volunteers for our Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten Project have completed training to conduct site visits at VPK programs, and those visits will begin soon. We still need to conduct training for volunteers who are seasonal residents, but we expect to have at least 16 people ready for site visits by the beginning of 2018. Lake/Sumter AAUW members who are now prepared for site visits are Liz Schweers, Anna Whipple, Beth Hicks, Lu Michaels, and Barbara Maloney. Other participants are League of Women Voters members, or friends who heard about the project and wanted to get involved.

Over the summer **Judy Bonn**, **Linda Carpenter**, and **Susan Gold** analyzed owner/director and teacher interview data as well as observation results from the pilot conducted last spring. Their most important finding is that VPK lead teachers are skilled in facilitating children's social/emotional development and in organizing their classrooms for learning, but they are challenged to provide effective instruction. Teachers are aware of this challenge, and they would like to have help with this. **Linda Carpenter, Susan Gold**, League members Joanne Coen and Gail Formanack are continuing their advocacy work. They plan to meet with House and Senate committee chairs to explain what VPK is and the issues about it.
