Diane Reichert helped to further the mission of AAUW by having her daughter visit with local students. Following is the newspaper article highlighting the informative session. Heidi Reichert Robes, a Senior Director with Biogen of Cambridge, MA, presented to 7th graders at The Villages Charter Middle School in FL on April 4. The presentation provided an overview of the Biotechnology Sector, Drug Product Development, and how many different careers paths were specifically available in Biomanufacturing from



research scientists, to manufacturing, engineering, marketing, finance, public relations and others. Heidi gave a comprehensive overview on her career path which began with this new business sector in the early '90s.Biogen develops, manufactures and markets innovative therapies for patients living with serious neurological, autoimmune and rare diseases and studies the variations in genetics that may influence treatments/drugs for diseases. The students were engaged with questions and got to conduct a simple laboratory experiment prepared by Biogen. The students investigated the genetic basis of taste by testing their ability to taste a bitter compound. With this activity, students had first hand involvement on the dramatic differences in how individuals experience taste and also discussed how genetic differences can influence an individual's taste perception. The Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten Project

The Lake/Sumter American Association of University Women (AAUW) in conjunction with the League of Women Voters of The Villages/Tri-County Ares (LWV) undertook a project to examine and summarize the voluntary pre-kindergarten (VPK) programs in Lake, Marion, and Sumter Counties. The members of the committee from AAUW were Linda Carpenter and Susan Gold with valuable editing help from Ginny Rivera. Those from the LWV were Joanne Coen and Margy Barrett.

VPK was mandated in 2002 with a constitutional amendment that required high quality programming for all 4-year-olds in the State of Florida. We were the first state in the United States to offer free voluntary pre-kindergarten statewide. All children who turn 4 by September 1 of any given year are eligible. Our committee was interested in how VPK programming is implemented in the tri-county area.

Currently, Early Learning Coalitions (ELCs) are responsible for declaring children eligible for VPK, for processing childcare applications, and for monitoring their compliance with state-mandated programmatic requirements. Three ELCs operate to oversee the VPK program in the tri-county area. They are Lake, Marion and Nature Coast ELCs. Our committee began by meeting with the directors and staff of the three ELCs in our catchment area.

A questionnaire was developed and distributed to the three directors of the ELCs. Subsequently, meetings were held with each ELC to determine responses to the questionnaire and learn more about how the ELCs operate. We were interested in: Children, Facilities, Teaching Staff, Child Assessment, Curricula, Funding, and Infrastructure.

The full 17page report which was written by Linda Carpenter and edited by Ginny Rivera is available on the Lake/Sumter AAUW website.

At the Annual Meeting of the League of Women Voters on Monday, March 21, 2016, they voted to continue the project for another year by visiting pre-kindergarten classrooms, seeing what other leagues in the state are doing re: VPK, and asking AAUW for continued partnership.
