# **VPK Project**

At their January 25, 2016, meeting, members of the League of Women Voters Tri-county Area/The Villages heard the results of the Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) project that has been conducted in recent months. A collaborative undertaking between the League and the Lake / Sumter AAUW branch, the project was designed to examine the VPK program in the tri-county area.

Branch members who participated in the project are Susan Gold (who is also a member of the League), Linda Carpenter, and Ginny Rivera. Susan suggested the idea to the League and the project was selected as a focused issue for the last year. Susan and Linda worked with League members Joanne Coen and Margy Barrett to develop a questionnaire which was distributed to the Early Learning Coalitions (ELCs) in the tri-county area. Susan, Linda, Joanne, and Margy conducted follow-up meetings with directors of each ELC to learn answers to the questionnaire items. Linda wrote the final report, and Ginny performed the technical edit of the document. Susan and Margy wrote a summary of the full report; members can read a copy on the Lake / Sumter AAUW Web site.

The results indicate that the VPK program, although mandated as a constitutional amendment in Florida, is seriously underfunded. While it boasts a high rank for access on a national survey of pre-kindergarten programs – clearly the result of the constitutional mandate – Florida's VPK ranks 36th of 41 programs surveyed for resources devoted to it. Moreover, the State's program meets only three of 10 quality standards specified by the National Institute for Early Education Research.

While the summary report is available now, the League will not release the full report until their annual meeting in March. At that time, decisions will be made about continuing the project. If approved, the next phase will involve site visits to VPK programs in Lake, Marion, and Sumter Counties.

In addition to learning the results of the project, meeting attendees heard ELC directors Roseann Fricks (Marion), Lesha Buchbinder (Lake), and Sandra Woodard (Sumter) talk about their programs.

Several Lake / Sumter AAUW branch members, some of whom are also members of the League, attended the meeting – including Anne Wilkins, Nancy Bell, Lou Michaels, Dotty Sasmor, and Laurel Rowen – and their interest in the project was appreciated.
