Tech Trek 2016

At this writing, Tech Trek 2016 is in full swing. The committee met on December 8th to coordinate all the nominations from the six participating middle schools. The twenty- seven applications were mailed soon after to give the students about a month to complete and return them. In February, we will set up interviews with all of the girls who have submitted their applications as well as interviews with their parents. Our "marathon meeting" will be held on February 23rd to review the applications, interviews and teacher recommendations to assess the qualifications of each girl for acceptance into the Tech Trek camp. A ranked list of six or seven girls will then be submitted to the Tech Trek State Coordinators for naming the final candidates.

As you can see, this process will ultimately choose the top sixty STEM students in Florida to attend the camp program. We will keep you posted as to our progress as we proceed.


