Coming Meeting October 8

Bone Health will be the topic of our monthly meeting on Sat. Oct. 8 from 10 AM to noon at Bridgeport Recreation Center, 1670 Lake Miona Drive in The Villages. Women over age 50 have the greatest risk of developing osteoporosis. Our program on Oct. 10 will be a lecture on bone health including participation in bone building exercises (which can help prevent bone loss) led by the Pimlico Bone Builders staff. We'll be sitting and using chairs for exercises. No previous experience is necessary. Wear comfortable clothing, flat shoes and bring weights if you have them. No reservations are required. Beverages and light snacks will be provided.


