Membership Dues

Starting in March we will be accepting AAUW membership renewals and new memberships for the year beginning July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. Checks are payable to AAUW Lake/Sumter. Portions of our annual dues go to National and State AAUW as well as to our local Lake/Sumter branch. After a decade of not increasing dues, National AAUW has raised dues by \$10 to \$59 this year. Florida State AAUW remains at \$12 and our Lake/Sumter branch at \$19, bringing the total dues for 2018-2019 to \$90. In case this proves to be a hardship for any of our members, we are establishing an "Angel Fund" to help anyone who finds they are unable to continue their membership due to the increase. Details of this are being finalized by the board.

In January Nancy Bell, a former Life Member of AAUW and a long time active member of our Lake/Sumter branch, died as a result of an accidental fall. She was living in Arizona to be near her family. In remembrance of Nancy Bell, \$50 was donated to the AAUW Eleanor Roosevelt Fund by our Lake/Sumter AAUW branch.
